Prof. B. Myrboh, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, NEHU, who inaugurated the celebration, highlighted the importance of Hindi and its usage, especially for the people of North East. "One feels its importance the minute one steps out of the

North East," he said adding that knowledge of Hindi will bring about integration.

Prof. D.K. Choubey, Head, Department of Hindi, was of the opinion that just as English is spoken and used in every sphere of life, so also should Hindi. He said that just as we have taken the effort to learn English, we should also do the same with Hindi. He also stressed on the importance of having a multi-lingual dictionary of Khasi, Garo, Hindi and English. It could be a dictionary having a word whose meaning is

given in Khasi, Hindi and English, he suggested. The same could be done with Garo, he added. In this way, one can learn more about the local languages as well as Hindi and English, he said. While appreciating the efforts made by the Hindi Cell, Prof. Choubey urged the gathering to take part in the programmes so as to make the event a grand success.

In his speech, Dr. L. Cajee, Registrar, encouraged the use of Hindi in official works and urged everyone to take part in the competitions organized

by the Hindi Cell.

Later, a Hindi magazine, 'Nehu Jyoti' was formally released by Prof. Myrboh.

Special Lecture Series in Linguistics

Dr. Alexander R. Coupe of Nanyang Technological University, Singapore delivered a lecture on the paper Nominalization and grammatical complexity in Tibeto-Burman and beyond, on July 9 at the Department of Linguistics, NEHU.

The paper drew on Mongsen Ao, Chang, Khamniungan and other languages of north-east India to demonstrate the diverse functions performed by nominalizing morphology in Tibeto-Burman and discussed the pathways by which such morphology extended its functions,

thereby creating new grammatical constructions in these languages.

Dr. Coupe also compared similar syntactic structures formed from nominalizing morphology in other languages of South Asia and beyond. His paper also demonstrated that cross-linguistically, nominalization arguably provides the single most important trajectory for the grammaticalization of complexity in grammar.

NEHU Alumni Association Formed
