'Semester System at UG level will be easier on Students'

7 ith the introduction of the Semester System at the undergraduate level this year, the College Development Council (CDC) organised a day-long Principals' Conference on Implementation of Semester System at UG level -Perspectives on Quality Management on May 1st 2015 at the Administrative Building, NEHU. Deans, Head of Departments and Principals of affiliated colleges participated in

the programme sponsored by the University Grants Commission (UGC), Academic Staff College, NEHU. In his inaugural address, Prof. P. Shukla, Vice-Chancellor, NEHU explained the need for the Semester System as it is more popular and successful for the students. "It works better because it is easier on the students," Prof. Shukla said while explaining how the system worked. He explained

that under the Semester System, teachers divide their courses in time periods of semesters, which really means four or more months of teaching and then examinations. "Students find this system better as it is easier to be examined on things that were taught more recently," he d d e Another great thing about the Semester System, Prof. Shukla said, is that a great deal of independence lies

with the teaching pro-

fessor. "It is the professor who sets the syllabus, it is he who debates what he wants to teach. If the students like him, then the word spreads and if he doesn't then they drop out. What this means is that there is continuous evaluation of not only the student but also the teacher," Prof. Shukla added. However, he said that this idea does not go down well with the affiliated colleges with a centralised examination system. "And that is why we have not been able to successfully implement this idea in our country, particularly in our university at the UG level," he said. Prof. Shukla hoped that by holding the conference, the current situation can be resolved. "There will certainly be teething problems of various kinds during the transition period but we need to persevere. We need to put our minds together to sort out how best we can negotiate this period," he said. Earlier, in her welcome address, CDC Director,

Dr. C.R. Diengdoh, informed that under the 11th Five Year Plan 2007-12, the UGC had its own policy on new initiatives of adoption of academic and administrative reforms in higher education in universities and colleges for enhancement of quality and excellence which has set the pace for implementation of the Semester System. To make the transition easier, Dr. Diengdoh informed that three resource persons namely Prof. K. Ismail, Chairman, Standing Com-

mittee on Ordinance/ Regulations, NEHU, Dr. L. Cajee, Registrar & Controller of Examinations, NEHU and Prof. R. Sharma, Department of Biochemistry, NEHU, would be giving in-depth information on NEHU ordinances, regulations, examination pattern as well as the prospects of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The inaugural function concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. L. Cajee, Registrar & Controller of Examinations.
