



## Mumbai Intl. Film Festival at NEHU

The Department of Journalism & Mass Communication, NEHU in collaboration with Films Division, Government of India organised a three-day non-competitive documentary, short and animation film festival entitled “MIFF in Meghalaya” from March 1st to 3rd at the Old Guest House, NEHU, Shillong.

The inaugural function of the film was held on March 1st at 1:00 p.m. with Prof. B. Mishra as the chief guest. During the festival 19 award-winning films of the Mumbai International Film Festival for documentary, short & animation films (MIFF) were screened. The festival included films from countries like Romania, UK, Australia and India.

The inaugural film of the festival was the Oscar-nominated film from India, *The Little Terrorist*, directed by Ashvin Kumar. It tells the story of a twelve-

year-old Pakistani Muslim boy who mistakenly crosses the mine-field strewn border into India and finds a Hindu school teacher who must find a way of hiding him from Indian soldiers looking for the ‘terrorist’ who crossed over.

Other films screened at the festival include *Ali and the Ball* (Australia), *Tamaash (The Puppet)* (India), *Raju & I* (India), *Music in the Blood* (Romania), *Photu* (India), *Bejinxed!* (India), *True Love Story* (In-

dia), *The Black Road: On Front Lines Of Ache’s War* (Australia), *Ukadi Pukadi* (India), *The Spell* (India), *Chhaya* (India), *The Elephant Boy* (UK / India), *Good Morning Mumbai* (India), *Unni* (India), *Fireflies in the Abyss* (India), *Amlu* (India), *The Lost Home* (India), and *The Moment of Accepting Life* (UK).

A special mention is *Fireflies in the Abyss*, a documentary directed by Chandrasekhar Reddy on ‘rat-hole’ mines in Jaintia Hills

where both boys and men risk their lives every day to dig coal out of hard rock, burrow-

## Koha on Cloud: Focus on Libraries in NE

A two-day advance level workshop to Implement Koha on Cloud: A Special Focus on Libraries in North-East India was held at NEHU from February 24th - 25th. The workshop was organised by the Central Library, NEHU, Shillong in collaboration with Informatics Global Pvt. Ltd. Bangalore.

The objective of the workshop is to create awareness amongst Librarians including library students and researchers in North-East India on the implementation of Koha, the Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) with a focus on the Cloud environment.

More than 90 participants comprising of librarians, researchers, students and staff from universities, colleges and institutes located in Meghalaya and other parts of North East region attended the workshop which was inaugurated by Prof. B. Mishra, Dean, School of Economics, Management and Information Science, NEHU, Shillong and chief guest on the occasion. He also inaugurated the

## Teaching the Teachers: Orientation Prog



**A** month-long General Orientation Programme for newly appointed teachers of higher education was organised by the UGC-Human Resource Development Centre, NEHU, Shillong, from January 23rd to February 19th, with an aim to enhance the skills, knowledge and efficiency of the teachers.

Dr. Quendarisa Kharbuli, the course

coordinator of the Orientation Programme informed that the major thrust of the programme was on basic modalities of teaching and learning process such as micro-teaching, philosophy of education, information technology, research methodology, curriculum development, question paper setting in accordance with CBCS, etc.

Addressing the

college and university teachers at the valedictory function of the programme, Prof. T.K. Kharbamon, Director, English and Foreign Languages University and the chief guest on the occasion, congratulated the participants on successful completion of the programme. She expressed the importance of such programmes in teaching and education, and hoped that the teachers could disseminate the knowledge gathered over the last one month, at their respective work places.
