He gave a heartfelt thanks to the team for giving ample time for interaction which would go a long way to further any accreditation to enhance the quality of academics. He said that both NAAC and NEHU are

trying to serve the cause of higher education keeping in view the maintenance of excellence which is the main objective and also enhancing the quality of teaching, learning, research and other aspects.

‘NEHU One of Most Disciplined Universities’

NEHU celebrated the 44th University Day on May 26, 2017 at the Multi-Use Convention Hall. The programme kicked off with a flag hoisting and lighting of the lamp by Prof. S.K. Srivastava, Vice-Chancellor, NEHU in the presence of teachers, students and non-teaching staff. This was followed by speeches from representatives of the NEHUTA, NEHUNSA and NEHUNSU. Appreciation awards were also awarded to four recipients from the Shillong campus.

In his welcome address, Dr. J.N. Nayak, Registrar reminded the gathering of the objective of the setting up of the University in 1973, which is to “disseminate and advance knowledge by providing instructional and research facilities to the improvement of the social and economical condition and welfare of the academic and cultural advancement.” Now with the advancement of technology we are living in an e-era, he said adding that this calls for some self-assessment

on the part of the University.

Speaking on behalf of the teachers, Prof. Xavier P. Mao also called for some self-criticism and stock-taking to make the University a place where new ideas can be created and disseminated. He listed out some issues dogging the faculty like timely promotion, accommodation for teachers as well as students and hoped that the administration would resolve these issues at the earliest.

Mr. Milford Thangkhiew, general secretary, NEHUNSA ex-

pressed his gratitude to those instrumental in setting up the University and hoped that the University grows from strength to strength. While appreciating the setting up of new departments, Mr. Thangkhiew lamented the diminishing staff which is now reduced to a bare minimum. He also mentioned the unique problem of the technical staff whose career arc remains stagnant. Expressing full faith in the leadership of the University authority, Mr. Thangkhiew hoped that these issues will be settled in an impartial manner.

Speaking for the student community, Mr. Napoleon S. Mawphniang, president, NEHUSU said as a student, he has a responsibility to the University and it is his duty to ensure that the University excels and scale new heights. Recalling some mistakes and bad decisions in the past, the student leader warned against vested interests and called for cooperation between the administration and NEHUTA, NEHUNSA and NEHUSU. He also called for more accountability and democratization in representation and decision making especially in matters relating to students’ welfare.

While expressing gratitude to the forefathers that helped set up the University, Prof. Henry Lamin, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, said it is the duty of the present lot to take NEHU to greater heights.

Taking heed of the issues raised by the representatives of NEHUTA, NEHUNSA and NEHUNSU, Prof. S.K. Srivastava, Vice-Chancellor, in his

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Government of India for a check on quality of the teaching-learning process, and this process of quality check gets divided into two parameters which are indicators for this quality assessment. “In this process the team goes through the self-study report prepared by the institution,” he said adding that every institution needs its shareholders to have discussions with the different stakeholders and a physical look at the environment in which this teaching-learning process goes through.

The chairman of the NAAC Peer team further listed four components of the teaching-learning process which are to learn, to do, to live and to be self. In the first component, the institution teaches the students by different methods be it classroom, audio-video mode or assignment mode. The second part is done by experimentations done in laboratories, by project works, basically anything done with our hands, Prof. Khincha said. The third component, according to Prof.

Khincha is imparted by the many activities that happen whether it is by the NSS, Sports Department, cultural programmes, clubs and youth programmes. “All these are part of the learning exercise that the University imparts to the students to make them learn to live in the community,” he added. The last compo-

nent of the teaching-learning process, he says, is to teach the students to have empathy, respect and attitude that is built by the personal example of the teachers. “So NAAC tries to capture all this in the assessment process,” he added.

Prof. Khincha then went on to list out some of the elements that stand out in NEHU foremost being the discipline of the students and the greenness of the campus. He said that the other thing that stands out is the way

NEHU has tried to keep pace with the requirement of the region. He however cautioned against complacency and urged the faculty to build up research more. Another positive is the student intake which he termed as good and transparent process. The other good thing he noticed is the gender issue

which in NEHU is in favour of the girl students. He also noted the opening of new campuses and hoped that they are up and running with the same vigour as the main campus.

The NAAC Peer team chairman lauded the governing structure of the University which he termed a “healthy practice” and the strong committed leadership. However, he is of the opinion that building a second-level leadership is an important component of an

institution and this can be done by bringing in new people in the structure and making them part of the administration structure.

Prof. Khincha also touched on some of the challenges facing the University namely attracting and retaining faculty. He encouraged the University to make all efforts to attract and

retain young as well as senior faculty. The other challenges he mentioned are developing courses which are both globally and locally relevant, getting funding for thrust areas of research that do not match the thrust areas of funding agencies and the sudden changes in education. However, he hoped that the University can rise to the challenge and build a brand that it can take pride in.

The programme finally concluded with a vote of thanks.

‘Give Opportunities to Young, Talented Minds’

The 24th Convocation ceremony of NEHU was held on April 28, 2017 at the Convocation Hall. A total of 8989 candidates received their degrees in the presence of the chief guest on the occasion, Dr. Vijay Kumar Saraswat, Niti Aayog, Prof. S.K. Srivastava, Vice-Chancellor, NEHU, Prof. Henry Lamin, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, Prof. G. Singaiah, Pro-Vice-Chancellor, NEHU Tura Campus and Dr. J.N. Nayak, Registrar.

In a rousing

speech, the renowned scientist and former chief of the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO) revealed what awaits the students after graduation and what is expected of them. He advised the graduating students that their aspirations cannot be met if they do not work hard. As a citizen of this country, each and everyone should be responsible for the development of India, he added. Dr. Saraswat said India being a vast sub-continent has demographic ad-

vantages which need to be nurtured by giving opportunities to the young and talented minds. Touching on the country's growth, he said GDP was growing handsomely at 7.3 per cent per annum and expressed confidence that a strong workforce of 400-500 million youths will push India into the league of developed nations. However, he bemoaned the fact that despite taking gigantic steps towards transforming itself into a developed nation, India still has around 300 million rural population

which lives under the BPL margin and a huge number of children in the country still suffer from malnutrition. Moving on to the topic of technology, he said India is the second largest mobile user in the world but the penetration was only 34 per cent. Mobile internet can be of great help in the rural health care sector and other such requirements, he pointed out. He also stressed on the need to introduce project managing skills in the country to develop entrepreneurship.
