

About the Workshop:

India, a country with a centuries-old heritage of medical science, first became familiar with the modern systems of medicine in the 17th century. There have been various developments in the health care sector in the post-independence era. But problems like higher population density, low socio-economic status of a significant number of people and low literacy rate in some parts of the country, have resulted in poor health indicators. Healthcare has become one of the largest sectors of the Indian economy, in terms of both revenue and employment. It has been growing at a CAGR of 22% since 2016, employing 4.7 Million people directly. The sector has the potential to generate 2.7 million additional jobs in India between 2017-22 over 500,000 new jobs per year. India's doctor-population ratio is 1:834, assuming 80 per cent availability of registered allopathic doctors and 565,000 Ayurvedic, Unani, Siddha and homeopathic doctors, Mansukh Mandaviya, Union minister of health and family welfare (Rajya Sabha April 5, 2022). In spite of the development in healthcare, the North-Eastern states are still facing problems like shortage of trained medical manpower, providing access to sparsely populated, remote, far-flung areas, improving governance in the health sector, the need for improved quality of health services rendered, making effective and full use of existing facilities, and making effective and timely use of existing resources.

In the light of the above scenario, this workshop is expected to provide the various opportunities available in the healthcare sector in North-East India and how to make it better in the near future.
