About the Workshop

and the general public. The following objectives outline the focus areas for the upcoming workshop:

1. Comprehensive Training on Open Access Publishing:

Fundamental Principles and Practices: Provide in-depth training on the core principles of open access publishing, including its history, evolution, and current trends.

UNESCO Values and Principles of Open Science: Explore how open access aligns with UNESCO's Values and Principles of Open Science, promoting transparency, inclusivity, and equity in the global research landscape.

2. Familiarization with Open Access Models and Ethical Standards:

Diverse Open Access Models: Introduce participants to various open access models—Gold, Green, and Hybrid—highlighting the benefits and challenges of each.

Open Public Licensing: Discuss the importance of open public licensing, with a focus on Creative Commons licenses, ensuring participants understand how to protect their work while promoting accessibility.

Resources for Ethical Publishing: Guide participants through the use of critical resources like the Directory of Open Access Journals (DOAJ), emphasizing ethical standards and best practices in open access publishing.

3. Effective Utilization of Open Publishing Platforms:

Open Journal System (OJS): Provide hands-on training in using OJS (Open Journal System), covering the entire workflow from installation and journal setup to submission management, peer review, and content publication.

Practical Exercises: Engage participants in practical exercises to reinforce their understanding of OJS, ensuring they can confidently manage an open access journal.

4. Integration of ORCID for Enhanced Researcher Visibility:

Understanding ORCID: Offer a comprehensive overview of ORCID (Open Researcher and Contributor ID), explaining its significance in the academic ecosystem for maintaining accurate and consistent researcher profiles.

ORCID API Integration with OJS: Demonstrate the integration of the ORCID API with OJS, enabling participants to streamline author identification and improve the accuracy of research attribution.

5. Promoting Global Collaboration and Innovation:

Networking and Collaboration Opportunities: Foster an environment that encourages networking and collaboration among participants, enabling them to share insights and best practices in open access publishing.

Innovation in Scholarly Communication: Inspire participants to explore innovative approaches in scholarly communication, leveraging open access to drive research impact and knowledge dissemination on a global scale.

By the end of this workshop, participants will be well-equipped with the knowledge, skills, and tools necessary to effectively engage in open access publishing, thereby contributing to a more equitable and accessible academic environment.
