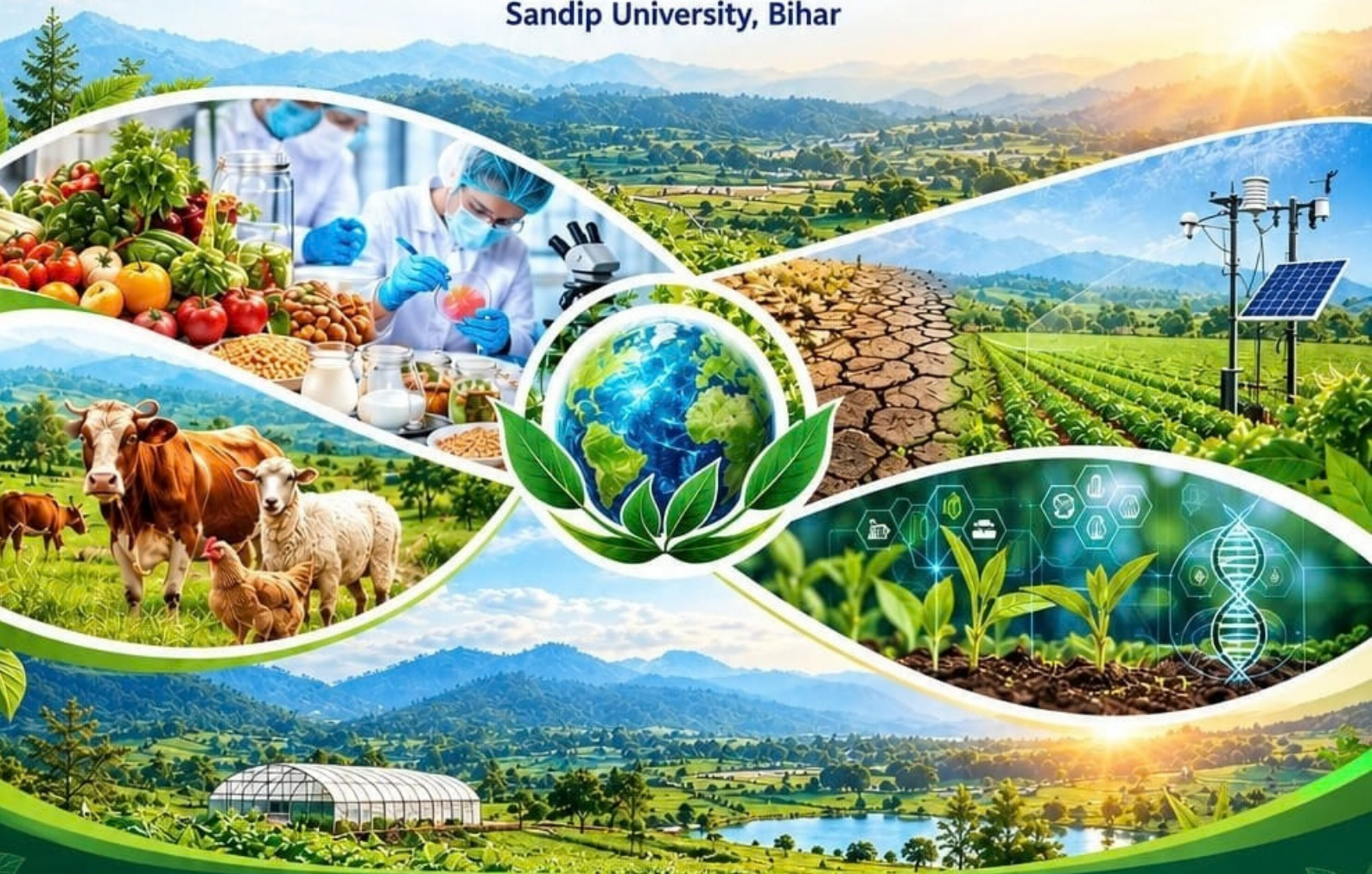

Presentations during Conference

Keynote Lecture / Lead Paper / Invited Talk: The Keynote and Invited Presentation Sessions will highlight emerging research, recent innovations, and significant developments related to the major themes of the Conference. For each thematic area, the Technical Committee will identify 2–3 eminent experts to share their knowledge and research perspectives. Each presentation will be scheduled for approximately 15–20 minutes, followed by a brief interactive discussion and Q&A session. Selected speakers will also be encouraged to submit a 3–4 page extended summary of their presentation for publication in the official Conference Proceedings.

Contributory Paper Presentations

This session provides an opportunity for researchers, academicians, and scholars to present their original research findings and innovative contributions relevant to the Conference sub-themes. Submitted papers will be evaluated based on their scientific quality, originality, relevance, and practical significance. Papers initially submitted for poster presentation may also be shortlisted for oral presentation based on the review process. Selected participants will be informed in advance and will be allotted 7–8 minutes to present their work, followed by a brief discussion or Q&A session during the designated technical sessions.

Poster Presentations

To encourage wider participation and effective exchange of research findings, Poster Presentation Sessions will be organized across all major thematic areas of the Conference. Submitted posters will be evaluated and categorized according to their respective themes for systematic display and discussion. Each session will be coordinated by a Session Chair and two Co-Chairs, who will facilitate interaction, summarize key findings, and highlight important recommendations emerging from the session.



Conference Presentation Awards

To recognize and encourage excellence in research, innovation, and scientific communication, outstanding presentations will be evaluated by a panel of experts. The following awards will be presented in each technical session:

- ▶ The title should be concise, specific, and clearly reflect the content and scope of the research work.
- ▶ The title and major headings should be written in CAPITAL LETTERS.
- ▶ The Extended Summary should be prepared in MS Word using Times New Roman font with normal formatting.
- ▶ The recommended font sizes are as follows:
 - Title: 14 Fonts, Bold
 - Authors' Names: 12 Fonts
 - Institutional Affiliation: 11 Fonts, Italic
 - Main Text/Content: 11 Fonts

PLACES TO VISIT NEAR GUWAHATI



Maa Kamakhya Temple Click to open side panel for more information is one of the oldest and most revered Shakti Peethas in India, situated atop Nilachal Hill. The complex features traditional indigenous architecture with beehive-shaped domes and offers sweeping panoramic views of Guwahati and the Brahmaputra River.

- Renowned pilgrimage destination dedicated to Goddess Kamakhya
- Known for its ancient stone carvings and peaceful hilltop ambience
- Best visited early in the day to navigate entry queues comfortably

Pobitora Wildlife Sanctuary Click to open side panel for more information lies roughly 45 kilometers east of Guwahati and holds the highest density of Indian one-horned rhinoceroses in the world. Its sweeping grasslands and wetland ecosystems make it an ideal day-trip destination for wildlife enthusiasts and photographers.

- High probability of spotting one-horned rhinos grazing in open fields
- Offers morning jeep safaris and guided elephant safaris
- Home to diverse migratory bird species during the winter months



Umananda Temple Click to open side panel for more information is a historic 17th-century Shiva shrine set on Peacock Island, recognized as one of the smallest inhabited river islands in the world. Reaching the island involves a scenic boat or ferry ride across the Brahmaputra River from the city ghats.

- Perched amidst lush greenery on an island in the middle of the river
- Accessible via government ferry services and private motorized boats
- Natural habitat for the endangered golden langur



Dipor Bil Click to open side panel for more information is a vast freshwater wetland located on the southwestern edge of Guwahati and designated as a Ramsar Site. It serves as a vital ecological haven, providing quiet waterfront trails and viewpoints away from the urban bustle.

- Prime destination for birdwatching, hosting hundreds of resident and migratory species
- Peaceful setting suited for morning walks, photography, and nature observation
- Occasional corridor for wild Asian elephants moving from nearby reserve forests

Sualkuchi Click to open side panel for more information is a renowned heritage weaving village situated about 35 kilometers from Guwahati along the north bank of the Brahmaputra River. Often referred to as the "Manchester of Assam," it serves as the heart of the state's traditional handloom industry, where rhythmic wooden looms operate in almost every household.

- Famous for producing pure indigenous silks, including golden Muga, white Pat, and warm Eri silk
- Visitors can walk through workshops to observe the entire artisanal weaving and loom process firsthand



Hajo Click to open side panel for more information is an ancient pilgrimage town located roughly 30 kilometers northwest of Guwahati, celebrated as a historic confluence of Hinduism, Buddhism, and Islam. The town sits amidst small green hillocks and historic water tanks, offering a tranquil day-trip destination with centuries of layered history.

- Houses the 16th-century Hayagriva Madhava Temple atop Monikut Hill, venerated by both Hindu and Buddhist devotees
- Home to Powa Mecca, a revered 17th-century Islamic shrine offering scenic hilltop views of the surrounding countryside



How to Reach Venue

1. From Lokpriya Gopinath Bordoloi International (LGBI) Airport

- Distance & Travel Time: ~2.8 km (5–10 minutes)
- Route: Via New Airport Road / SOS Road, heading south toward VIP Chowk / opposite STPI.

Transit Options:

- Auto-rickshaw / App Cabs (Uber, Ola, Rapido): Easiest and quickest option directly from the arrival terminal.
- Airport Taxi: Pre-paid taxi counters are available inside the terminal.



2. From Railway Stations

A. Guwahati Railway Station (Paltan Bazaar / Panbazar)

- Distance & Travel Time: ~22 km (45–60 minutes depending on city traffic)
- Route: Paltan Bazaar → Bharalumukh → Jalukbari Rotary → NH 17 (Airport Road) → VIP Chowk / Borjhar.

Transit Options:

- App Cabs / Pre-paid Taxis: Readily available 24/7 outside both the Paltan Bazaar and Panbazar exits.
- ASTC Airport Shuttle Bus: Regular air-conditioned buses run directly from the ASTC bus stand (Paltan Bazaar, near the station) to LGBI Airport. You can disembark near the VIP Chowk / STPI stop just before the airport entrance.
- Shared Cabs / Mini Buses: Shared trekkers/magic vans and city buses run from Paltan Bazaar/Adabari toward Azara/Borjhar.

B. Kamakhya Junction Railway Station (Maligaon)

- Distance & Travel Time: ~14.5 km (25–35 minutes)
- Route: Maligaon → Jalukbari Rotary → NH 17 → VIP Chowk / Borjhar.
- Transit Options:
- If your train halts at Kamakhya Junction, disembarking here is closer and avoids city center traffic. App cabs, private taxis, and autos are stationed outside.



3. From Bus Stands

A. ISBT Betkuchi (Inter-State Bus Terminal)

- **Distance & Travel Time:** ~21 km (30–40 minutes)
- **Route:** NH 27 (Guwahati Bypass) → Jalukbari Rotary → NH 17 → Borjhar.
- **Transit Options:**
 - **App Cabs / Taxis:** Available directly outside the ISBT terminal gates.
 - **City Bus / Shared Cabs:** Take a bus/shared vehicle from ISBT to Jalukbari Rotary, and switch to an Airport/Mirzapur-bound shared vehicle or bus.

B. Adabari Bus Stand

- **Distance & Travel Time:** ~13 km (25 minutes)
- **Transit Options:** Adabari connects western Assam districts and is located near Jalukbari. Direct shared autos, Wingers, and city buses ply frequently between Adabari and Borjhar / Airport.



Local Landmark for Drivers

When navigating locally, ask the driver for:

"New Airport Road, opposite STPI (Software Technology Parks of India), Borjhar / near SOS Children's Village."

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
