About NEHU

The North-Eastern Hill University, a Central University, was established by an Act of Parliament (Act 24 of 1973), at Shillong, the capital city of Meghalaya. The prime objective was to set up a teaching and affiliating Institution for the hill areas of the North-Eastern Region in order to develop the intellectual, academic and cultural background of the people of this region. The University became functional on July 19, 1973 with Dr. Chandran D. S. Devanesan as its founder Vice-Chancellor. The Permanent Campus of the University located at Mawlai Umshing, Shillong, in the East Khasi Hills District is geographically surrounded with hill tops and Pine trees spread about Twelve Hundred acres (approx) of land area. The administrative department and the examination block are surrounded by the academic departments so as to have easy accessibility for the students.

Keeping with its objective, the University has been striving for the academic excellence of the people of North-Eastern region. The University comprises eight schools: School of Economics, Management, and Information Sciences (SEMIS), School of Education (SE), School of Humanities (SH), School of Human and Environmental Sciences (SHES), School of Life Sciences (SLS), School of Physical Sciences (SPS), School of Social Sciences

(SSS) and School of Technology (SoT). The University has forty-seven academic Departments and a Centre for Distance Education (Figure 1). Thirty-six Departments and one Centre are located in Shillong campus, with eleven Academic Departments situated in Tura campus.
