#### GOVERNMENT OF MEGHALAYA HOME (POLITICAL) DEPARTMENT

#### **ORDER**

No. POL.75/2020/PtI/88

Dated: Shillong the 19th April, 2021

In view of the rapidly rising COVID-19 cases in the State, it has become necessary to notify additional restrictions on permitted activities.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred under Section 22 of the Disaster Management Act, 2005, the undersigned, in his capacity as Chairperson, State Executive Committee, MSDMA, hereby directs that the restrictions on permitted activities in the State issued vide Notification No. POL.75/2020/Ptl/87, dated 16-04-2021 be modified as follows:

1. Entry of tourists from outside the State shall not be permitted from 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2021 up to 7<sup>th</sup> May, 2021.

#### For Shillong Urban Agglomeration w.e.f. 20th April, 2021:

- 2. All Schools shall remain closed till 3<sup>rd</sup> May, 2021. MBOSE examinations shall continue as per schedule.
- 3. All Public functions and Social / Private gatherings are prohibited except for weddings and funerals limited to a maximum of 50 persons and with prior permission from the Deputy Commissioner, East Khasi Hills.
- 4. Health Department, Home (Police) Department, Fire and Emergency Services shall function at 100% strength.
- Personnel of State Government Departments as notified by Personnel & A.R (A)
   Department vide Notification No. PER.62/2020/28, dated 19-04-2021 shall work
   from home. All other Departments shall function at 100% strength for Group 'A'
   & Group 'B' officers and at 50% strength for Group 'C' & Group 'D' staff.
- Central Government offices shall function at 100% strength for Group 'A' & Group officers and at 50% strength for Group 'C' & Group 'D' staff.
- 7. Private offices to function at 50% employee-strength.
- 8. Bars, Hotels and Restaurants to function at 50% seating capacity. People are advised to avail take away food services in preference to on-premise dining.

Despite repeated advisories, it is still observed that SOPs relating to COVID-appropriate behaviour are not being followed strictly by all citizens. Citizens are advised to exercise caution, follow all protocols and adhere to the SOPs to ensure that the State does not see a resurgence in cases.

All Deputy Commissioners and Superintendents of Police are to intensify the enforcement measures for strict compliance of the protocols and social distancing norms. They shall strictly impose fines on violators and send a Daily Report on the fines collected to the Home (Political) Department, Government of Meghalaya.

Deputy Commissioners may regulate the schedule and timing of activities. They may also restrict the activities depending on the local COVID situation and to meet the social distancing norms.

#### OFFICE MEMORANDUM

Subject: Preventive measures to contain the spread of Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) - Vaccination of all Central Government employees- regarding.

The undersigned is directed to state that this Department has been issuing instructions, from time to time, regarding the preventive measures to contain the spread of COVID-19. Vide O.M of even number, dated 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2021, all Central Government employees of the age of 45 years and above were advised to get themselves vaccinated, so as to effectively contain the spread of COVID-19. They were further advised to continue to follow covid-appropriate behaviour, even after vaccination, particularly, frequent washing of hands/sanitization, maintenance of social distancing and putting on of masks etc.

Government has been monitoring the situation very closely, and it has been decided to vaccinate all the citizens who have attained the age of 18 years and above. Accordingly, in partial modification of the O.M. of even number dated 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2021, all Central Government employees are advised to get themselves vaccinated so as to effectively contain the spread of Covid-19. Further, they may continue to follow covid protocols, even after vaccination, as advised vide the said O.M.
