## Blended mode program on Bio-Entrepreneurship Opportunities in Meghalaya

September 07, 2022: The opening ceremony of the blended mode sensitization series in "Bio-Entrepreneurship Opportunities at Meghalaya" organised by BioNESTBioincubator Facility, NEHU, Tura Campus in collaboration with PRIME Startup Hub Meghalaya was held at PRIME Hub on the 7th



of September 2022 with 48 virtual and 60 physical attendees. Mr. Flo Oberhofer, Program Head, PRIME, Shillong welcomed the gathering and highlighted the prospective sectors of Bio-resources in Meghalaya such as Floriculture, Food Pro-




cessing, Medicinal & Aromatic Crops, Spices, Nutrition, etc. in which Bio-entrepreneurship in Meghalaya can flourish. In the keynote lecture, Dr K Karthikeyen, Chief Executive Officer (CEO), North-East Agriculture Technology Entrepreneurs Hub (NEATEHUB) discussed the opportunities and scopes of Startups in Agricultural and allied sectors in NER being one of the mainstream livelihoods generating sector. Dr Karthikeyen further discussed the challenges of entrepreneurship in the initial stage especially in the hilly areas and the importance of incubation centres as enablers in promoting these enterprises and handholding emerging start-ups to create more jobs in this sector. He also voiced the need for innovative approaches for setting up sustainable enterprises and the kind of support available

from various

departments of the Government. This was followed by a prolonged interactive doubt clearing session. In the next session, Ms. Alva Margareth Kharkongor, Program Manager, BIRAC BioNESTBioincubator (B3I) Facility, NEHU, Tura Campus introduced the participants about the goals and activities of B3I Facility, highlighted the focus areas, role of B3I in Business Development, and the service they offer.



In the post-lunch session, Dr Suman Kumar Nandy, CEO, BioNEST Facilty, NEHU Tura Campus, elaborated the gathering aboutthe various funding schemes of Biotechnology Industry Research Assistance Council (BIRAC) with special mention to the ongoing Biotechnology Ignition Grant for north-eastern Region (BIG-NER) opened

This was followed by a presentation from Mr. Jefferson Rani, Manager, PRIME Hub, IIMCIP, about the role of PRIME Hub in boosting the entrepreneurial ecosystem all over Meghalaya and various schemes and programs implemented by them to support entrepreneurs from various fields and sectors.

The final session was the My Story Session from Ms. Trinity Saioo, Padma Shree Awardee, 2020. Ma'am Saioo narrated her struggles, hurdles, determination, opportunities, partners, and eventual success in their collective journey of "Turmeric Trinity". Everyone was overwhelmed by Ms. Saioo's journey and applauded her efforts. This was followed by a talk and demonstration session by Mr. Justman Synrem, an entrepreneur from Sohara who manufactured fuel through pyrolysis of plastic wastes. The session was very dynamic and accompanied by a massive interaction session

between the achievers and the participants. At the end of the program, a few prospective entrepreneurs interacted with the BioNEST and PRIME representatives and pitched their ideas and discussed the opportunities of incubation.

Mr. Trivedi highlighted the initiatives of MSME, the sectors and schemes under MSME, its contribution to the country's economy, the benefits of UDYAM Registration, training, financial assistance, and other opportunities available through MSME. He also discussed the "MSME Innovative" scheme, a new initiative, for the innovators with a combination of funding, mentorship, incubation, design intervention and IPR Protection in a single mode approach at a MSME recognised host institute. Mr. Trivedi also informed the par-



ticipants that NEHU will soon have the status. Further ahead, Mr. SST Sangma from

District Commerce & Industries Centre (DCIC), Government of Meghalaya spoke in detail about the eligibility criteria, benefits and application procedure of various schemes implemented by DCIC including Skill Development Trainings at departmental training centres and at industrial units beyond the state, Master Craftsman, Rural Artisan, Bee Keeping programmes, PMEGP Schemes, Meghalaya Industrial & Investment Promotion Scheme (MIIPS 2016).

This was followed by a lecture on the prospects of Food Processing in Meghalaya by Dr LS Pereira, Associate Professor, Department of RDAP, NEHU. Dr Pereira discussed the richness of biodiversity in the state, the importance of food processing, reducing food wastage and scope of Food Processing Industries in the field of Entrepreneurship. She emphasized on

using local seasonal fruits for processing into several food products apart from sell-

ing in fresh form, which can generate more income and in turn improve the standard of living of the farmers. Food processing will also enhance the choices of the consumers. Dr Pereira also talked about the challenges and strategies to overcome them as well as the growth drivers of food processing, to wit Strong Domestic Demand, Supply Side Advantages, Export Opportunities and Proactive Government Policy and Support. The lecture was complemented by a talk from





Ms. Rupa N Arengh, Manager (Sanction) Retail Asset Credit Centre (RACC), Tura on banking schemes available to entrepreneurs. Ms. Arengh elaborated on a few loans like Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana (MUDRA Loan), SME Smart Score which is a simplified Loan for working Capital needs and Acquisition of the fixed assets. In the next session, Dr Suman Kumar Nandy, Chief Executive Officer, B3I Facility discoursed the role of BIRAC Bio

NEST Bio incubator Facility on Business Development, the various Schemes of BI-RAC for researchers, faculty members, students and entrepreneurs with innovative ideas, and about the handholding program provided by the facility to transform an innovative idea into a sustainable and profitable business. This session was followed by doubt clearing sessions. The program ended with a vote of thanks from Ms. Alva Margareth Kharkongor, Program Manager of B3I Facility.



#### **Report on Enabling Entrepreneurship through Academia at St. Anthony's College, Shillong**

September 23, 2022: The awareness program on 'Enabling Entrepreneurship through Academia', an initiative taken by BIRAC Bio NEST Bio incubator (B3I) Facility was conducted in St. Anthony's College on September 23, 2022, from 1:00 PM onwards. In this program, a group of 11 faculty members from three neighboring institutes of Shillong namely, St. Mary's College, William Carey University and St. Anthony's College participated. The program started with a self-introductory



session of the B3I team and Dr Suman Kumar Nandy, Chief Executive Officer of B3I narrated the long-term goal of the program as ensuring incubatee flow for the development of entrepreneurial ecosystem in Meghalaya and the role of the faculty members as "Entrepreneurial Ambassador" helping the enablers in scouting the innovative minds among the student community. Dr Nandy further briefed the audience about the role of B3I Facility in Business Development through the presently available tri-phasic hand-holding program with infrastructural, mentoring and funding support. 
#### Webinar on Compliances & Certifications in Food & Nutrition




Akademi award in the year 2021 for her short story collection 'Sivappu Kazhutthudan Oru Pachaiparavai'. The Department of English, NEHU Tura Campus ushered in the program, and Professor Namrata Pathak, Assistant Professor of the Department of English. NEHU Tura Campus welcomed the speaker and the audience at the onset of the program. Professor Sujata Gurudev, Campus In-charge, NEHU Tura Campus stood before the audience to give an introduction of the speaker. Speaking on the occasion, Ambai said that translation is not only a shift between two languages but also between two different cultures. Emphasizing on translating an Indian language into English, she reiterated that translation is also many times an act where the translator reinterprets our culture for us, and that translation often creates a hierarchy between the translator and the translated. The



translator who translates an Indian language into English always feels that it is an act of favour, where the Indian language writer is being raised to a superior level. The Indian language writer also feels this act of translation to be some kind of a upliftment. Number of students and scholars who attended the program were beguiled by her sense of humour and vibrant narratives. Dibyajyoti Sarma, a poet and writer from Assam accompanied Ambai and added charm to the program. The program ended with a shower of blessings from above.

Sayan Dey, Faculty Fellow, The Harriet Tubman Institute, York University, Canada




and Postdoctoral Fellow, WITS Centre for Diversity Studies, University of Witwatersrand, Johannesburg delivered a lecture on "How to de-racialize research works? Critical Race Study (CRT) as a methodological framework" on 24th of August, 2022. The event was organized by Dr. Namrata Pathak from the Department of English, NEHU, Tura in collaboration with CTEF, Meghalaya Chapter. Sayan Dey spoke on how usually, any form of research work is underlined with multiple forms of binaries, hierarchies, and power dynamics are already determined prior to initiating a research project and some of these aspects are manufactured in the process of conducting the research. These challenges are underlined with caste, class, gender, cultural, racial, geographical, and topographical biases and topographical biases that are collectively generated and systematized by the societies. The lecture focused on the aspect of racism and impacts the methodologies, arguments, and outputs of research work in humanities and social sciences. In order to justify the arguments, anonymous examples of research dissertations will be taken from different higher education institutions across India and the world. The lecture also reflected on how Critical Race Studies (CRT) can function as a methodological practice of dismantling these hierarchies.

#### Special Talk by Professor K.C. Baral

Professor K C Baral, former Pro Vice Chancellor of EFLU, Hyderabad delivered a

special talk on NEP 2020: Diversity, Disciplinarity and Humanities Education in NEHU, Tura Campus on 31st August, 2022. #### Learning Outcome Based Education (LOBE)

Learning Outcome Based Education (LOBE), as an innovative approach to designing student learning and carrying out formative and summative assessment, has been put forward by the University Grants Commission (2019) and the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. LOBE is developed on the concept of Outcome Based Education (OBE) advocated by William Spady (1994). OBE clearly focuses and organizes everything in an educational



system around what is essential for all students at the end of their learning experiences. In an outcome-based education system, outcomes or learning outcomes are the main considerations around which the entire teaching-learning process is designed. Outcomes are clear learning results that we want students to demonstrate at the end of significant learning experiences. They are actions and performances that embody and reflect learner competence in using content, information, ideas, and tools successfully. The LOBE approach gives importance to Programme Learning Outcomes (PLOs)-significant and essential learning which students can demonstrate at the end of an academic programme/course. In the present scenario, PLOs



of every HEIs need to be designed based on the graduate attributes required out of an academic programme. In response to this, targeting the Degree students and teachers of Higher Education Institutions of Garo Hills region of Meghalaya, the Department of Education, NEHU, Tura Campus, organized a Community Extension Programme entitled 'National Education Policy, 2020 and the Roles and Policy of Higher Education and Reforms of Assessment in Higher Education' at Mendipathar College, North Garo Hills District, Meghalaya on the 1st of November 2022. Coordinator of the programme, Prof Nikme S C Momin, speaking on the "Assessment Reforms in Higher Education from the perspectives of NEP, 2020", emphasised the importance of "graduate attributes" like knowledge, skills, attitude, and values when he/she graduates a programme. "Memorization without understanding" but "meaningfully mapping the

concepts and discovering the information" of the contents under each unit in a lesson of a course and the programme was rated. It was reported that, countless degree level students do commit to "learning with meaningful understanding"; many students still use "rote memorization" during their examination in HEIs. This may have resultantly reflected in their learning outcomes of the first ever recent CUET-PG (2022) conducted National Testing Agency (NTA). Issues and challenges concerning unappealing picture of Meghalaya's Garo Hills region was discussed with

an alarming note. Dr Tilok Thakuria, Teacher In-Department of Charge, History & Archaeology likewise interacted on the topic "Preparing for National Level Examinations with Special Reference to CUET: Issues and Challenges". Dr Rubul Bania, Teacher In-charge of Department of Computer Applications, NEHU, Tura conceptualized tangibly "On Role of Internet and Online Examinations" from the perspective of



National Education Policy, 2020.
