# National Seminar on Human Rights concludes in NEHU on a high with signing of MoU with a film Production Company



Date: April 03rd, 2023: Under the joint auspices of National Human Rights Commission, New Delhi and Department of Hindi, NEHU, a two-day national seminar was organized at NEHU, Shillong on the topic 'Different Perspectives of Human Rights in Literature and Society'. On this occasion, as the keynote speaker of the program, Prof. Soma Bandhopadhyay discussed the various dimensions of human rights. "Human rights depend on social consciousness which can be restored through proper education" she said.

The chief guest of the program and member of the National Human Rights Commission, Mr. Dnyaneshwar Manohar Mulay described human existence as a part of human rights and said that where there are human beings, there are human rights. For this it is necessary for the human being to be sensitive. Mr. Mulay described the ancient Indian traditions as endowed with human rights and the edicts of Ashoka as the first manifesto of human rights which was inscribed by Ashoka for his subjects after the Kalinga victory. In his multifaceted statement, the

chief guest emphasized on rights and said that if you do not raise your voice, you will not be able to use your fundamental and legal rights.

In his presidential address during the closing ceremony, the Vice - Chancellor of NEHU said that

# "A house where the human rights of women are protected, the women are safe and secure." At the same time, he told that

by violating the boundaries, there has been violation of rights in the family and society as a result of which people are forgetting their duties.

Shri Sanyal, a member of Economic Advisory Council of Hon'ble Prime Minister delivers lecture on "Next 25 years of reform"



Date: April 17th, 2023: A Youth 20 (Y20) lecture under NEHU's initiatives for G20 is held and renowned technocrat, author and policy advisor Shri. Sanjeev Sanyal delivered the distinguished lecture entitled, "Next 25 years of reform". Shri. Sanyal, a member of Economic Advisory Council of Hon'ble Prime Minister of India visited NEHU to deliver such an important policy oriented lecture to enlighten NEHU faculty, students, staff, researchers and others about the course of reform that India is going to undertake in next two decades or so. Shri Sanyal delineated need for transparency, innovation, efficiency and quick solutions to pending problems of delivery from the system and advocated a faster path of reform with due interventions from the Government.

The Lecture was organized by Office of International Affairs of NEHU with the aim to re-understand India's attempts to emerge into a global economic power by pursuing practical solutions to serious problems of

running the system.

Shri. Sanyal, as a cult figure, because of his writings of best-selling books like Land of the Seven Rivers, The Ocean of Churn, India in the Age of Ideas, and the Indian Renaissance has been a celebrate policy think tank, whose presence enthralled a huge audience. Ideas of reform, spelt out in terms of judicial reform, financial reform, bureaucratic reform and overall, the need for finding avenues of opportunities for the youth was emphasized by Shri. Sanyal.

Vice-Chancellor Prof. P.S. Shukla in his speech pointed out the strength of India's present leadership and argued that India will be able to go through all difficulties and can evolve a path of self-reliance and self-development.

Shri. Sanyal was introduced in a befitting manner Prof. Anand Shankar Dixit. In his brief address, Prof. Dixit, Registrar-in-Charge of NEHU explained the synergy between economics, natural sciences and technology that NEHU has built up over the years and in the present juncture, NEHU is following a path of contributing to national agenda of growing the economy by innovation and research.

Date - April 17th, 2023: The North-Eastern Hill University, as part of the Youth 20 under G20 organized a meeting of Directors of all the central educational institutes such as EFL University, NEIGHRIMS, NEIAH, ICAR, IIM Shillong etc. in presence of Shri. Sanjeev Sanyal, Member, Economic Advisory Council of the Prime Minister of India to discuss common issues and problems of research and collaboration. The meeting had prominent citizens of Shillong as invited guests. As the discussion centered on problems faced by higher educational institutions in attracting investments for industry-oriented research, participation from wider sections of society was solicited. Accordingly, presence of educational cum business personality Shri B. L. Bajoria attended the dinner cum brainstorming session with Shri. Sanjeev Sanyal and other prominent thinkers and practitioners.

The meeting discussed issues like importance of more funding for research from industries, investors and governments. Shri. Sanyal, being Advisor to PM's Economic Council suggested that research funding as an issue can be taken up at the appropriate bodies. It needs to be examined whether no. of applications for research funding has gone much higher in last few years and what is the success rate. Shri. Sanyal wanted that the idea of funding be based on a more realistic assessment. Prof. Nalin Mehta, Director of NEIGHRIMS highlighted the need for training young researchers on how to pitch a new problem and how to propose a novel solution through research. On a question on basic research, Shri. Sanyal pointed out that funding is no issue and in Social Sciences, the Indian Council of Social Sciences Research has been given good amounts by various relevant Ministries. But according to Shri . Sanyal, not enough workable and implementable ideas were brought out in various fields of basic research. He implored the gathering to take up the problems with grant-making bodies like DST, SERB, DBT, ICSSR and the like.

The meeting ended with the common idea of presenting institutions and universities of Meghalaya and Shillong to avail and create conditions of growth and progress.

#### MOOCs workshop for teachers and students conducted at NEHU



It was attended by faculty members, staff, Ph.D. scholars and students of the Department. Prof. M.N. Karna was one of the pioneers of the Department of Sociology, NEHU who contributed significantly in shaping the Department which was established in the year 1976. One of the stalwarts of the Department, he was instrumental in contributing to the growth and development of research in Sociology of the North-East India. Among his many achievements, Prof. Karna was the recipient of Lifetime Achievement Award, the highest and most coveted award given by the Indian Sociological Society. The "M. N. Karna Young Sociologist Prize", an award conferred to the topper of M. A. (Sociology) examination is an ongoing award which was contributed by him and instituted by NEHU. He has authored a number of books and articles in renowned International and

National Journals on various topics related to Development, Ethnic Movements, Tribal cultures and Tribal Movements. He was also an able organizer of various academic events with impeccable organizing ability. His vibrant and kindhearted nature will be missed by many. His demise is indeed an irreparable loss to the Department and academia at large.

A two minute silence was observed and heartfelt condolences were sent to the bereaved family.

#### Department's Farewell program for Prof. Henry Lamin

Date: April 28th, 2023: Prof Henry Lamin had joined the Department of Anthropology as a young faculty on the 7th May 1988. He was one among the first batch of M.A. students who had completed both his M.Phil (1986) and Ph.D. (1992) in Socio-Cultural Anthropology. He had worked under the supervision of Prof. H. K. Bhat. His research topic for M. Phil dissertation was on the "Commercial Exploitation of Forest Resources in two Jaintia villages and its impact on Social and Cultural Institutions" while his Ph.D.



degree was on "Pnar Economy and Society: Changing Frontiers of a Tribal village in Meghalaya". Under his supervision 14 Ph.D. scholars had been awarded their degree from this University.

In 1991 he was elected to the Meghalaya State Legislative Assembly from Nartiang Constituency, Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya. He rendered his services as Minister of Education in 1993-94 and Minister of Soil Conservation and Transport in 1997-1998, Government of Meghalaya.

In administration, Prof. Lamin had served as the Pro

Vice Chancellor during 2015-2021 and also as Chief Vigilance Officer of this University.

He also continued as Director, College Development Council in various capacities overseeing the development initiatives for a Deen Dayal Community College, at Wahiajer, West Jaintia Hills District, Meghalaya. Officially NEHU had felicitated him as a retiree on 28th February 2023 however, the Department could bid adieu to him with a farewell program held on 28th April 2023 at the Cluster Classroom 101 (Non Science Block).

## A Glimpse of Meghalaya, "The Legend of Ka Kshaid Nohkalikai"



Once upon a time, in the picturesque land of Meghalaya, there was a small village nestled in the heart of Sohra, called Rangjirteh. The village was surrounded by lush green hills, adorned with countless waterfalls and among them, was the most magnificent and awe-inspiring famous waterfall known now as Nohkalikai Falls. The villagers grew up with the legend of Nohkalikai, passed down through generations. It was said that the waterfall derived its name from a tragic tale of a woman named Likai. Likai was a young and beautiful Khasi woman who reside with her husband and baby daughter.
