Department of English holds a special Career Counselling Session with special assistance from NIELIT, Shillong



Date: June 14th, 2023 : A special career counselling session was held on 14 June 2023 for the NEHU MA 4th semester students. It was organized by the Department of English, NEHU with special assistance from NIELIT, Shillong. The session was conducted by career guidance experts Mr. Subir Baruah and Mr. Deepankar Singh of The Beginners Career Coaching, Golflink, Shillong.

The session began with a welcome address by Ms. Beccagrace Rynjah (NIELIT Instructor). She spoke about the importance of professional career counselling and how it can help students make informed decisions about their future. Mr. Baruah then gave a 50 min presentation (with slideshow) on the different career options available to MA/MSc graduates. Among many discussions, he also gave insights on public speaking skills, interview skills, confidence- building habits, overcoming "Comfort Zones", and honing "People Skills".

In the second half of the sessions, the challenges of job hunting and job prospects were discussed. The challenges were introduced to the students through the use of real- world statistical data, i.e. the Meghalaya state population of 35 lakh people out of which 11.55 lakh are within the 18-34 job-seeking age group (as of 2022). Other career-related topics such as understanding market demand, researching career prospects, SEO jobs, Freelancing jobs, etc. were also discussed. The counselling program was followed by a brief feedback session and concluded with a photo session at the end.

Department of Mass Communication organizes a Mental Health Awareness Workshop



Date: June 26th, 2023: **Stress** and faced by students and scholars is a growing issue. Constant deadlines, extensive academic course load, substantial studying, assessments and exams, and classroom competition tend to pressure university students, resulting in poor mental health if not adequately tackled. To address this issue, a workshop on mental health awareness was organised on 26th June 2023 by the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication, North Eastern Hill University, to create awareness of mental health among master's students and PhD scholars of the department. The workshop primarily focused on the stress and anxiety faced by students in their academic pursuits and ways to cope with them. Mr Nathanial Kharmujai and Ms Adelina B R Shylla were invited as the key speaker of the workshop.

This interactive workshop started by deepening the understanding of the participants on stress and anxiety. The speakers explained the different types of stress – good and bad- by giving suitable examples. Good Stress is beneficial and helps in motivating students. In comparison, bad stress harms our stress.



They introduced the concept of optimum level stress, distress and eustress, focusing on how the participants can benefit from the positive aspect of stress, namely, eustress.

After stress, the discussion moved further to anxiety. The difference between stress and anxiety was explained – stress as a response and anxiety as a feeling. It was explained how anxiety can manifest in different ways, including physical, cognitive, emotional and behavioural symptoms.

The nature and impact of academic anxiety, anxiety disorders, procrastination, perfectionism, lack of focus and concentration, imposter syndrome and burnout in work were also discussed. The discussion ended with various a discussion on various coping mechanisms – time management, self-care, seeking support, breaks, setting realistic expectations, communicating with the supervisor etc. Additionally, they also discussed different relaxation techniques – deep breathing, imagery and progressive muscle relaxation. A vote of thanks and a gift as a token of gratitude was given by the department.



A Glimpse of Meghalaya, "Behdiengkhlam Festival"

Behdiengkhlam is a traditional festival celebrated by the Pnar in the Jaintia Hills region of Meghalaya, a northeastern state of India. This vibrant and joyous festival is a significant cultural event for the Pnar community and holds immense religious and social importance.

The word "Behdiengkhlam" translates to "driving away the plague" in the local Pnar language. The festival is held annually, usually in the month of July, and is believed to ward off evil spirits and diseases from the community. It is a way for the Pnar people to express gratitude for a bountiful harvest and seek blessings for the well-being and prosperity of their community. One of the highlights of Behdiengkhlam is the grand

procession or "Rots" that takes place in the town of Jowai, the cultural hub of the Jaintia Hills. The procession involves a group of young men rhythmically beating large wooden pillars called "tokor" on the streets. The synchronized pounding of the tokors is believed to drive away evil spirits and ensure a disease-free year ahead.

Another important aspect of the festival is the "Dance of Men" or "Ka-Shad Mastieh." Men, dressed in traditional attire, gather at a sacred pool known as "Aitnar" to perform this traditional dance. The dance is accompanied by the beats of drums, wind instruments (tangmuri), and other indigenous musical instruments. It is a spectacle to behold as the dancers showcase their



agility, strength, and coordination, captivating the spectators with their rhythmic movements.

Behdiengkhlam also includes various sporting events and games, such as traditional archery competitions, tug-of-war, and boat races. These activities not only add excitement and entertainment to the festival but also promote unity and camaraderie among the participants and the community as a whole.

The festival also serves as an occasion for the Pnar people to showcase their rich cultural heritage. Traditional costumes, intricately designed headgear, and vibrant ornaments are worn during the festivities, adding to the colorful ambiance of the celebrations. Local delicacies and traditional cuisine are prepared and shared, strengthening the sense of community



and togetherness.

Behdiengkhlam is more than just a festival for the Pnar people; it is a time of reverence, celebration, and cultural pride. It connects the community with its roots, fosters social harmony, and reinforces the values and traditions passed down through generations. The festival is a testament to the cultural diversity and richness of Meghalaya, making it an important part of the state's cultural tapestry.

Behdiengkhlam culminates with a symbolic immersion of the sacred tokor pillars into a nearby river or water body, marking the end of the festival. This act signifies the departure of evil spirits and the cleansing of the community, bringing the festival to a close.



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
